Following the success of our first festival in 2021, we are once again opening our doors to friends and family and members of the local Angmering community.

There is so much we have to share with you this year. The big news is that we have been awarded the Gold Arts Award by The Arts Council. This award recognises the importance that our school places on teaching creativity and the arts, as well as acknowledging the range and quality of opportunities we provide for our students beyond the curriculum.

The festival starts with our Open Day on Saturday 18th June. We have a packed schedule of events including our Art, Photography, Design & Technology exhibition (p.8), a cricket match with a vintage tea provided by students and staff from our food department (p.10). There will be archaeological activities provided by Timesekers throughout the day as well as a number of musical performances (p.11 & 12). We will also be undertaking some Urban X Stitch, with the help of our friendly local yarnbombers.

During the festival we have opportunities for students, friends and family to take part in artist visits, talks and workshops as well as STEAM fest, which will be a fun-filled evening of activities that unite Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics (p.19).

As Covid restrictions have lifted this year, our performing arts departments have been able to reintroduce two key events in the school calendar. The first is Music Mania which showcases the talent and skill of our young musicians (p.17), the second is our end of year, whole school production. Romeo and Juliet will be performed over two dates and concludes our festival this year (p.22).

Continuing to develop our important partnerships with Angmering Parish Council and Arun Inspires, we will be organising a second Art Trail with ten venues taking part around the village.

I am so proud of our amazing school community and I hope that you are able to take part in our celebratory festival this year. I know that students and staff are looking forward to sharing their skills, passions and creativity with you.

Come and explore the art block where you will find artwork from every one of our Key Stage Three students who have been learning about the Formal Elements and Landscapes (Year 7), exploring portraiture and our local folklore and sea shanties (Year 8) and Animals and Street Art (Year 9).

Our amazing final year GCSE and A-Level students will be presenting their personal projects spanning all range of interests and disciplines. Our Year 10 GCSE artists will be showcasing their recent Blue Planet projects.

In our fantastic photography studio, you will find work produced by our GCSE and A-Level photographers. Their final projects will be up to explore, including an installation piece set up in the darkroom. Year 10 Photographers will show off their emerging technical skills sharing work from the Formal Elements and Conceal and Reveal projects.

FROM 5 PM FRIDAY 17TH JUNE & FRIDAY 29TH JULY

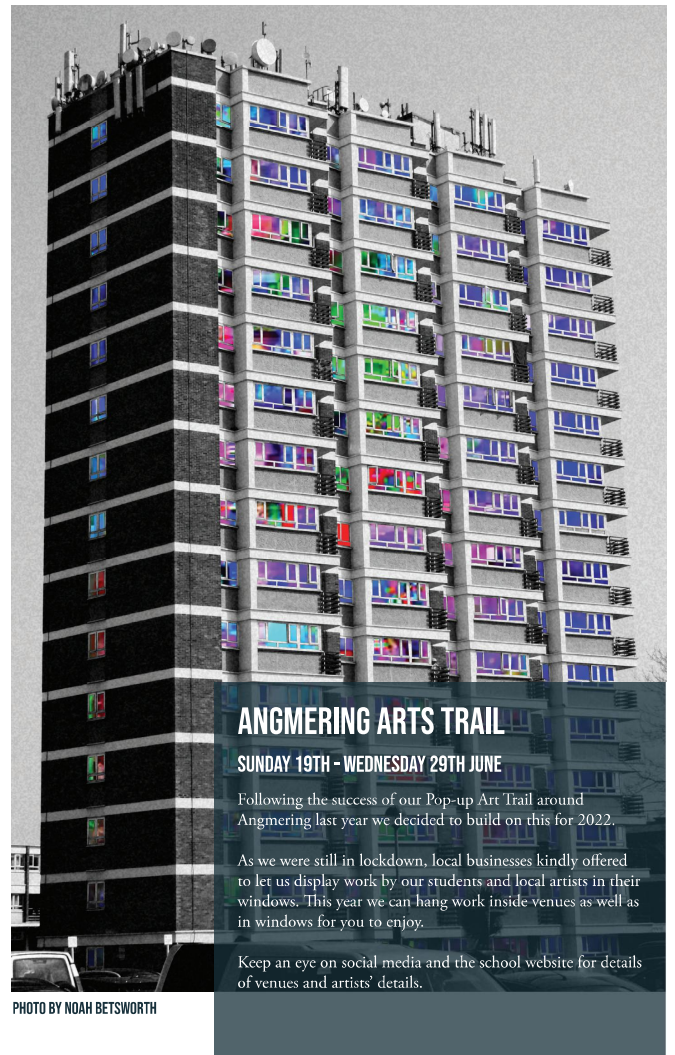

PAINT A MURAL WORKSHOP

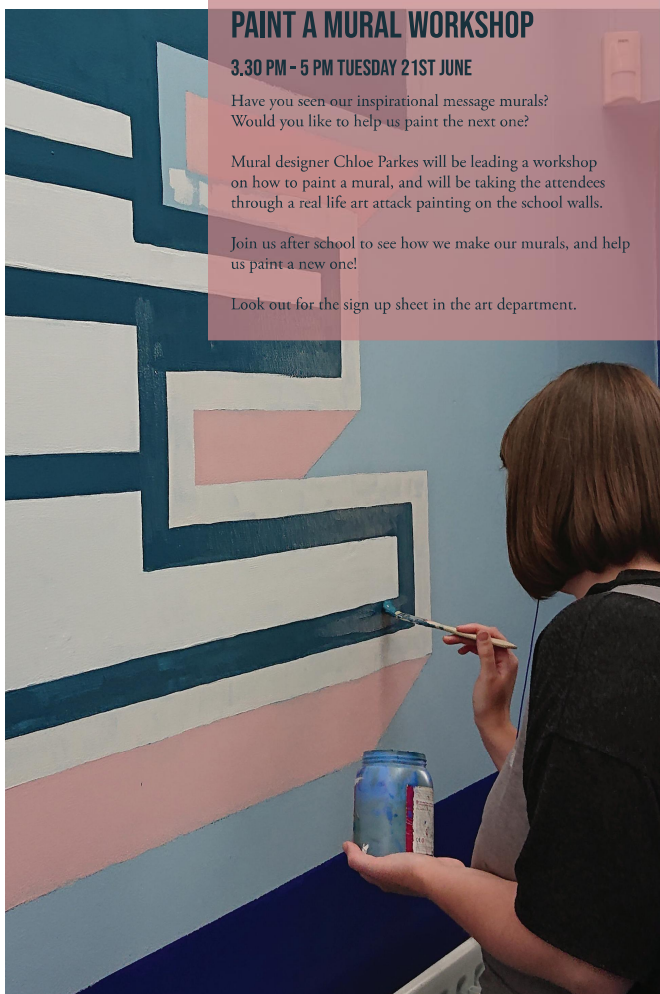
3.30 PM - 5 PM TUESDAY 21ST JUNE

Have you seen our inspirational message murals? Would you like to help us paint the next one?

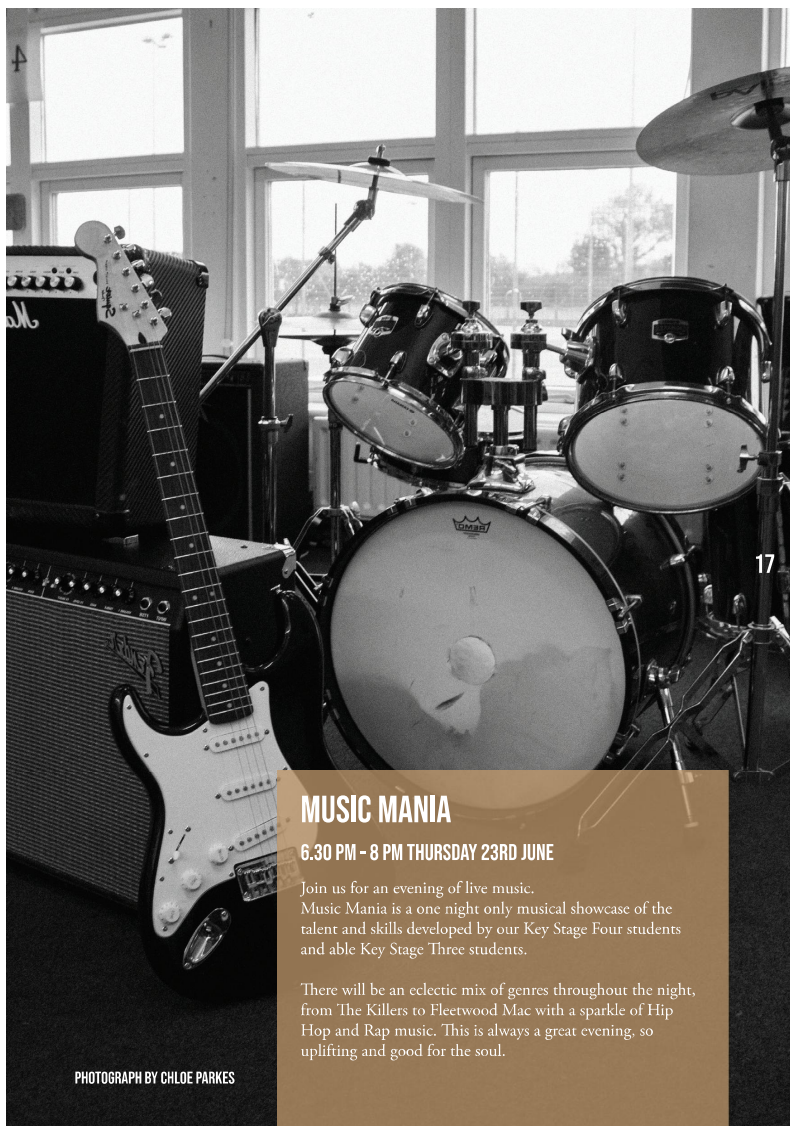
Mural designer Chloe Parkes will be leading a workshop on how to paint a mural, and will be taking the attendees through a real life art attack painting on the school walls.

VISITING ARTIST: IAN MURPHY

ALL DAY TUESDAY 28TH JUNE

Once again we will be hosting Ian Murphy for a day of drawing workshops for our Year 10 and Year 12 Art students.

Murphy is an established artist who creates atmospheric tonal drawings and oil paintings based on architectural detail as well as recreating places he has visited. Murphy travels internationally, gathering inspiration from all over the world. He exhibits worldwide and enjoys visiting schools during his time in the UK to share his techniques and knowledge.

Murphy will lead a fast-paced session focusing on graphite and ink drawings working on interesting surfaces. Students will develop their own practice and we have found that this day really boosts the confidence of young people who feel that they 'can't draw'.

Last year, Ian also presented a talk alongside an exhibition of his work for staff and friends of the school. This was such a success that he will be offering this again. Watch out for details of how to secure your place on social media.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP: CREATIVE LIGHTING

3.30 PM - 5 PM WEDNESDAY 29TH JUNE

This is an opportunity to learn new photography skills in a practical and exciting workshop. Participants will learn about Chiaroscuro - the lighting style in art and photography that is characterised by the use of bold contrasts between light and dark. This will be an opportunity to get practical and take creative portrait photographs using three different lighting set-ups. We will learn how to experiment with natural light using everyday materials, learn about the possibilities of using smartphones as a light source in a creative way, and learn how to take dramatic portraits using just a phone and some paper. Workshop participants will come away with a toolkit of easy-to-replicate lighting styles to either get started with portrait photography or push their portrait photography further.

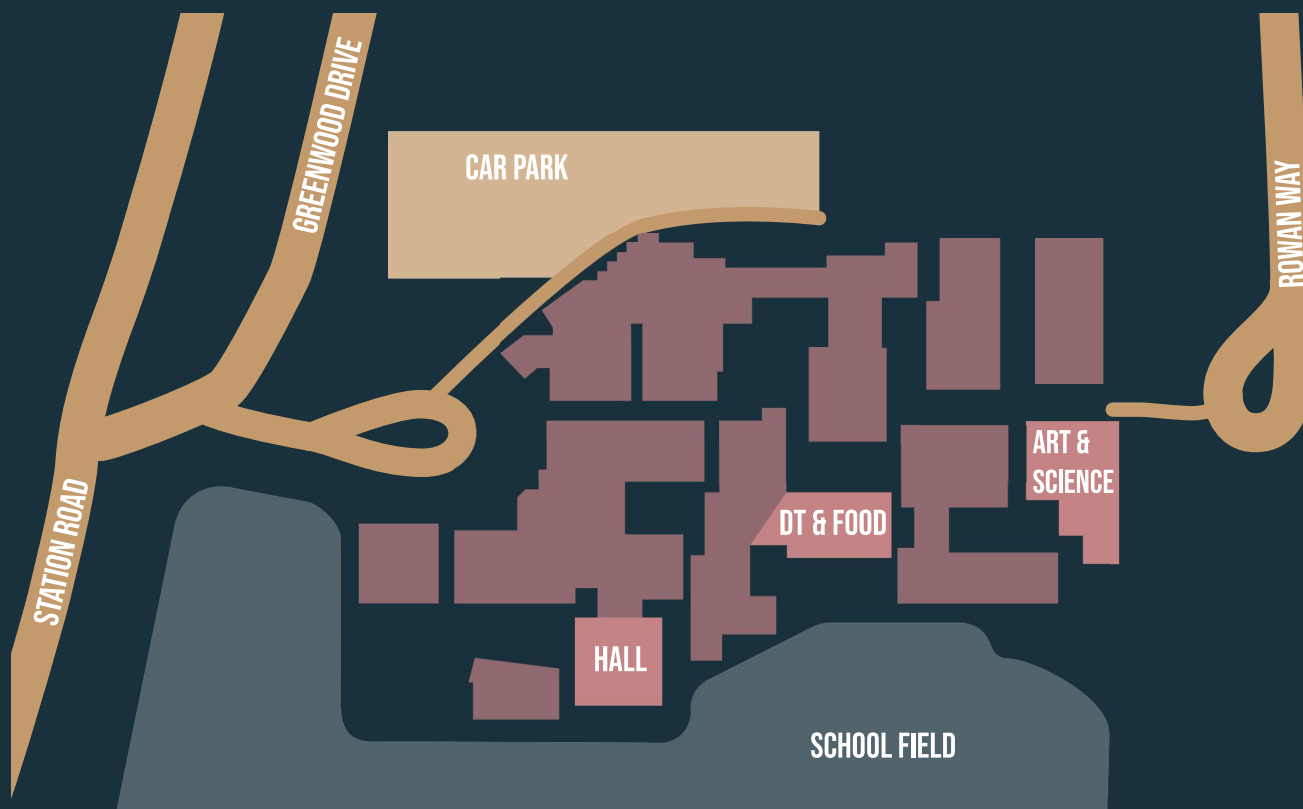
SCHOOL PRODUCTION: ROMEO AND JULIET

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GETTING HERE:

TRAIN - THE SCHOOL IS A TEN MINUTE WALK FROM ANGMERING TRAIN STATION, STRAIGHT UP STATION ROAD.

BUS - THE 700 COASTLINER BUS WILL TAKE YOU TO WORTHING ROAD JUST ROUND THE CORNER FROM ANGMERING TRAIN STATION, IT IS A TEN MINUTE WALK FROM HERE TO THE SCHOOL.
