

A meeting of the Full Governing Body held on Wednesday 20 November 2024 At The Angmering School.

APOLOGIES

1. Apologies were received in advance of the meeting from Mrs Thomas and were accepted by the board.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

- 2. There were no declarations of interest for the agenda
- 3. Annual Pecuniary Interest forms were completed by the board and returned to the Clerk.

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

- 4. The Board welcomed and appointed the school's new Finance Manager, Mrs Silva as an Associate Governor.
- 5. Mrs Mitchell was invited and accepted to serve a further term as Co-opted governor.
- 6. Mrs Genge Parent Governor term of office ends 26th January 2025 The Clerk will arrange an election at the beginning of the Spring Term.

URGENT MATTERS

7. There were no urgent matters.

CORE SUBJECT - SCIENCE

- **8.** Presentation (copy att) by Subject Leader Mrs Savage(CSA) on the Strategic plan and focus for the coming year. (see attached presentation, ignoring table on first page). **The following questions were raised:**
 - a. Primary AQA Mastery has this been static/worse/ regarding skills?CSA
 replied that it has been worse since Covid, significantly difficult, but getting
 better, increasing transferable skills.
 - Core subjects along with others, being picked up, is there a whole school approach? - CSA stated that Oracy and Numeracy, writing long answers may not be overtly taught.
 - c. Is there staff buy in? CSA stated it was fair to say, mastery shift 100% buy in



- d. Is there a difference in Quality of Teaching and engagement? CSA stated that there has been some impact since streaming of groups and rewritten schemes of work work well for staff and students, with clear tasks. Initial response is 100% quality far superior.
- e. Has there been a change in how frequently skills assessment data is viewed? CSA answered that this varied as some units have 2 (writing and skills assessments) but on average there are 3-4 assessments each half term which include improvement work time.
- 9. The Chair thanked Mrs Savage for her presentation and time, and offered any further questions to be submitted to the Clerk. Mrs Savage left the meeting.17:23 hrs

BEHAVIOUR & ALTERNATIVE PROVISION

- **10.** Presentation (copy att) by Mr Gooding (AssistantHeadTeacher) **raised the following questions:**
 - a. BEHAVIOUR Governors asked if there had been any feedback regarding the new behaviour system. The HT confirmed there had been little negative feedback from parents. Student Voice - they like the same day detention. The school has used scripted language with both students and parents.
 - b. Governors asked if all staff are consistent and what is being done if not. HT confirmed that the expectation for all staff has been shared at coplanning and Twilight meetings. Internal and external cover supervisors have the support from the on-call team
 - c. Governors acknowledge that during their summer and autumn term link visits staff appear on board and students see others being dealt with. But would like to know how the senior team deals with inconsistency with particular staffing members and what is being done to support them? AHT confirmed that support will be offered along with further training identified by data produced.
 - d. Does the impact get shared with staff? AHT plans to share data after first term which will be used to guide all staff of the model way of implementing well.
 - e. **ALTERNATIVE PROVISION (AP)** Governors asked how we compare to other schools AHT confirmed that we currently have 22 students who access AP in varied forms, which is a higher number compared to other schools due to having placed more funding in this area.
 - f. Governors wished to know if they are all or mainly related to SEN- AHT confirmed that the majority of the students are on route for an EHCP however, there are a number who the parents would like an EHCP but the student does not meet the threshold.
 - g. Elective Home Education (EHE) numbers have increased, in the main due to students being at risk of permanent exclusion, Emotional Based School Avoidance (EBSA) or to avoid fines from WSCC.

REPORTS TO GOVERNORS

- 13. **Headteacher's Report (copy att)** HT informed the board of the updates to staffing since writing the report.
- 14. HT was pleased to report that September 2025 intake numbers are 249 First Choice and 155 Second Choice, the board congratulated the HT and his team.
- 15. Governor questions from the report as follows;
 - a. The HT confirmed there to be high number of EBSA girls in year 11 opting for EHE despite support in place, in the main due to avoid fines, parents can obtain online GCSE courses for a private cost.
 - b. Governors wished to know if there was a link between behaviour and EHE it was confirmed that there is a high SEND or EBSA need and just one EHE has been linked to behaviour to avoid a permanent exclusion.
 - c. Governors were pleased to hear the new behaviour system has resulted in disruption free classrooms and teaching, and congratulated the school on the clear message home to parents.
 - d. WSCC Termly Visit report Governors were pleased to read a positive and supportive visit report, the HT reports that he is happy with the support package on offer and confirms we are doing all the right things.
 - e. External Cover expenses were discussed and it was confirmed that the cover team is now fully recruited but that there had been some long term staff absence which had impacted on costs in this area.
 - f. Student Standards Card (positive and negative points) system was explained to the board.
 - g. School Improvement Plan Clerk to update links on the GVO

FINANCE

- Governors had received the Budget Monitoring folder on the GVO in advance of the meeting. Highlights to be aware of as follows;
 - a. Extra funding made available amounting to 165,000.00
 - b. More concise reporting will be available from January 2025
 - c. 3 year Budget deadline extension to 20 December. Governors **agreed to delegate the approval of the 3 year budget** to the Chair and HT.
 - d. National Insurance increase will be given a grant in April which should cover the entire amount from the dedicated schools grant
 - e. Finance Manager and the Headteacher meet regularly and are confident that the deficit can be clawed back effectively with support from the Pay Grant.

MINUTES AND MATTERS ARISING



- 17. The minutes of the FGB meeting held on 2 October 2024 were approved by the board as a true record, and were signed by the Chair.
- 18. There were no matters arising.

SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION

19. Mrs Charlesworth confirmed that she had **completed** the Lead Governor in Safeguarding training, and would like to **share the powerful message** of the "Power of 12" with the board with a revised report at the January meeting.

20. The Operations Manager confirmed that the school is compliant with H&S and has the support of WSCC in the absence of a Premises Manager. She also confirmed that the school is hosting a Pool Plant Operator training course during February half term open to WSCC schools in the area

CHAIRS ACTIONS

- 21. **School Buildings:** Statutory Maintenance and Inspection Requirements and Staff Premises Training The Chair confirmed the Governors Statutory Responsibility has been checked and approved including the Alternative Provision sites to ensure checks and measures are in place and in date.
- 22. **Staff Survey**, Survey results shared with the board in advance of the meeting, the Chair acknowledged that the survey having been issued to staff during the restructure process may have upset some staff. And ask the board if there were any questions for the Headteacher.
 - a. Question 15 Governor asked if the school has a Bullying or harassment at work policy and it was agreed to look into this.
 - b. Communication was discussed and agreed that feed back to staff will go out in the Spring Term.
 - c. Any negative comments, the Headship team will ensure that staff take accountability for their own positions and speak to relevant staff.
 - Governors consider running the staff survey at a different time of year and consider pre or post Spring Break following the bedding in of the new behaviour system.
- 23. Student Survey Governors request consideration of using a different system for students to complete the survey as it was noted that some tutor groups had zero returns- it was also noted that the last question regarding being proud to be a part of the school was heartening and indicative of the new behaviour system.
- 24. **Parent Survey -** Considerations for a focus on questions and what feedback is required.



25. The Chair reported on the newly renamed PTA group 'FAnS' (Friends of Angmering School) and plans for the coming months - relaunch meeting 11th December, all welcome.
