# The Angmering School Home Learning Policy (2024)

#### **Policy Overview**

#### Purpose of Homework

Homework, called Home Learning, helps students learn better at Key Stage 4 and 5. Research shows good homework can improve progress by 5 months. Good tasks linked to classroom learning can give an extra 6 months of progress. (<u>EEF Report on Homework</u>). Key points for good homework are:

- Quality over quantity
- Well-designed tasks linked to classroom learning
- Clear aims for homework
- Address barriers like access to resources
- Teach independent learning strategies
- Give high-quality feedback
- Monitor impact on student progress

### Key Stage 3 Homework

- Year 7: Gradual increase in homework in the first term.
- English, Maths, Science: One task per week of up to 60 minutes.
- Humanities, Languages, Computing: Minimum twice per half term.
- DT, Art, Music, Perspectives, Food Technology, Drama, Dance: Minimum once per half term.

#### Key Stage 4 Homework

• All subjects: 30 minutes to 1 hour per week. Maximum of 2 hours per day.

### Key Stage 5 Homework

• All courses: Up to 3 hours per day.

## Setting Homework

Homework should:

- Use deliberate practice and retrieval practice.
- Help students recall and apply knowledge.
- Be part of a clear curriculum plan.
- Fit into categories like retrieval practice, vocabulary acquisition, skill practice, revision, coursework (KS4/5), and flipped learning (KS5).

# **Expected Results**

This approach aims to make homework more useful and aligned with classroom learning. Students will understand its purpose, know more, and remember more.

# **Consequences for Not Completing Homework**

- 1. Students get a day to complete missed homework.
- 2. Missed homework logged with one behaviour point added.
- 3. Options for catch-up:
  - $_{\odot}$   $\,$  After-school catch-up session in departments.
  - Central catch-up session held twice a week.
- 4. Failure to attend catch-up sessions adds another behaviour point.
- 5. After five missed homework logs, an automatic letter is sent to parents.
