

Moving up to Angmering - Issue 4

Year 7 Curriculum

The move to secondary school marks an important period in any student's learning. It is vital to get the transition from Year 6 right so that every student can continue to make progress and flourish. The Angmering School's curriculum experience in Years 7 - 9 is designed to be exciting, challenging and engaging. The aim is that all students are ready for their GCSEs and continue to develop their skills and appetite for learning.

One of the questions that we get most often is 'What am I going to learn?' We have a two week timetable so, over the course of 2 weeks, you will have 50 lessons. There is a table below which shows the number of lessons in each subject that Year 7 students will have on their timetable.

On the first day in school on the 5th September, year 7 tutors will spend some time making sure that all students understand their individual timetable and where they need to go for lessons. They will also get at least two tours of the school!

Learning Support

We have a massive amount of experience and expertise within the school when it comes to supporting any additional learning need. We have received a lot of information from primary schools and any learning support plans will be transferred to us over the course of this term so that all our teachers are aware of any additional support that students may require in lessons.

The three key members of staff who lead our SEND provision are Mrs Gatford, Mrs Knight and Miss Webb.

Mrs Lou Gatford (SENDCO)

Main role: Mrs Gatford co-ordinates the SEND provision in school and along with a team of excellent teachers and support staff, ensures that support is provided where appropriate. She works most closely with students who have EHCPs and also with those whose needs are presenting as beyond the level of 'school support.'

Mrs Vicky Knight (Assistant SENDCO)

Main role: Mrs Knight coordinates the SEND provision for students who are identified as requiring 'school support'. This typically means ensuring all practice across the school is appropriate for the needs of learners who may experience a degree of challenge in accessing their education, as well as coordinating additional provision where appropriate.

Miss Nat Webb (Teacher in Charge of the SSC)

Main role: Miss Webb coordinates support for all students with an EHCP with a physical disability or sensory impairment. She coordinates LSA support and specialist therapy provision and is part of a team alongside Miss Spencer (QToD) and Mr McNamara (QTVI).
