# **NEU Strike day on Tuesday 2nd May**

As a result of the government's refusal to discuss an improved offer for school funding, staff pay and conditions, the NEU has confirmed that they are calling on their members to strike again on **Tuesday 2nd May**. As I am sure you are aware, staff who are striking are very committed to their roles and do not take this decision lightly.

Teachers in the NEU who choose to join this strike lose a days pay in order to campaign for an appropriate, fully funded pay rise. Official information from the Department of Education has been misleading as the latest offer would have to **come out of the school budget** (apart from 0.5% of the rise) which would impact on the quality of teaching and learning. As a school we allocate around 85% of our government funding to staff salaries, the remaining 15% pays for all other learning resources. An unfunded pay rise for teachers of 4% effectively cuts this 15% down to 11.6% (a reduction of 23% in the funds available to pay for all other resources). This will result in a poorer experience for your children and it is this which teachers' are fighting against.

As with the previous strike days support for these actions is likely to be strong amongst our (predominantly NEU member) teaching staff. With student safety in mind we have therefore made the decision to move to **online lessons for this day.** 

Teachers who are not joining the strike will deliver live lessons to their classes and have been asked to confirm that these lessons will be running by no later than 8:30 on Tuesday morning. Communication will be via Google Classroom and Google Mail, which all students have access to provided they can access the internet.

Where students do not have a live lesson (because their normal teacher is joining the strike) they should stick to their normal timetable but access subject related resources from the following nationally approved platforms:

When not in live lessons, Year 11 and 13 students should focus on revision for their final exams using past papers or other resources which have already been provided for them by their teachers.

<u>Please also note</u> that Monday 1st May is a <u>National Bank Holiday</u> and school will be closed as normal.

To start the game, Durrignton went on to score an early try and convert (7-0). Angmering quickly responded with a try scored by Vice Captain Joseph Wood but unfortunately Charlie Boughton-Leigh failed to convert (7-5). Later in the half, Iker Naylor had a brilliant line break scoring a try right under the post and giving Charlie an easy conversion (7-12). Durrignton's strong defence was tough to break down, but after some excellent play from Angmering moving the ball across the pitch, Joe Wood went on to score a try in the corner making it a difficult conversion for Charlie Boughton-Leigh (7-17).

Moving into the second half, Durrington came out fast but some excellent defence from Alfie Tolly and Ewan Rowling the ball was won back and Iker Naylor once again showed brilliant power and speed to break the Durrignton line and score under the post making it an easy conversion for Charlie Boughton-Leigh (7-24). Once again, Durrington's strong defence was tough to break down but eventually after 8 phases Alfie Tolly scored and Charlie Boughton-Leigh went on to convert (7-31). Durrington quickly responded with back to back tries but failed to convert on both occasions(17-31). Moving into the final stages of the game, Joseph Wood intercepted a pass and scored a try just before the final whistle (12-36).





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#### **Connections Drama**


