First Aid has permanently moved to B14



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CAREER OF THE WEEK

Radiographers take scans of patients to diagnose and treat illnesses and injuries.

You can get into this job through:

- a University course
- an Apprenticeship

Day to day tasks

SCHOOL

As a diagnostic radiographer, you could:

- interpret images of the body to diagnose injury and disease
- screen for abnormalities
- take part in surgical procedures like biopsies

Career Progression

With experience, you could become a sonography specialist, radiography team leader or consultant practitioner.

You could also take further qualifications to specialise in:

- counselling and palliative care
- the use of certain techniques or equipment
- working with specific groups of patients
- research and teaching



UNIVERSITY

You'll need to do a degree or postgraduate qualification approved by the Health and Care Professions Council to become a radiographer. Your choice of degree course will depend on whether you want to work in diagnostic or therapeutic radiography. You may be able to take a fast-track

postgraduate qualification over 2 years if you're a health professional or have a relevant degree. Extra student financial support may be available through the NHS Learning Support Fund.
