This week's word of the week is **wear**, **were**, **we're**, and **where**. Similar to the word last week these are words that often confuse students. They sound similar, but their meanings are very different.

Wear means to have clothing on or to deteriorate. For example, 'can I **wear** shorts to school if it's too hot? Or '**wear** and tear'.

Were refers to the past tense. For example '**Were** you there when it happened?'

We're is short for *we are*. For example, '**we're** going to win this competition'

It may help if you have customer service experience and can speak a second language.

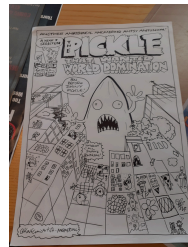
In this job, you'll:

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Recipe of the Week - Sausage Rolls

Ingredients

250g Puff pastry

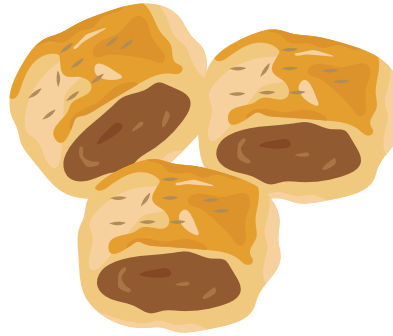
6 meat or vegetarian sausages

50g sage and onion stuffing

1 egg

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180/350/gas mark 4, and lightly grease a baking sheet.
2. De-skin the sausages and put them in a bowl.
3. Add the sage and onion stuffing.
4. Mash together using your hands.
5. Roll out the puff pastry to a rectangular shape.
6. Cut the pastry into strips of 15cms wide.
7. Crack the egg into a separate bowl and whisk.
8. Paint the egg wash along the long edge of one side of each rectangle.
9. Mould the sausage meat mixture back into a sausage shape and place along the puff pastry.
10. Roll up the sausage meat in the pastry ending at the egg wash end, which will work as glue to stick the pastry together.
11. Cut in small sausage rolls and place on the baking tray with the join in the pastry on the bottom.
12. Cook for 20 minutes or until the pastry has risen and is golden brown.



Year 7s helped vote for the picture book of the year

Year 7s were delighted to hear that their favourite picture book has just won two national awards! During a recent Perspectives lesson they all looked at the eight books which had been shortlisted for this year's Yoto Carnegie Medal for Illustration. After lengthy debate around the tables each student voted for their favourite and "The Tree and the River," a wordless picture book by Aaron Becker, was top choice across the year group. Children nationally agreed with them, so the book was awarded the Shadders Choice medal alongside the the Yoto Carnegie Medal which is awarded by a panel of Librarians. School Librarian Mrs Kemp commented, "This is one of my favourite projects of the year! The excited buzz of conversation around each book is a joy to hear. This year's winning book shows the urbanisation of a small area of countryside over time and gives the hopeful message that nature will survive despite mankind's mistakes."
