## A message for parents/carers from the National College

11th November marks the beginning of Anti-Bullying Week, and this year's theme is "Choose Respect".

Statistics from the Anti-Bullying Alliance reveal that 40% of children in the UK have suffered some form of bullying within the last year, with the most common experience being name-calling and verbal abuse. While it can have several causes, this kind of behaviour is commonly seen when a disagreement between two youngsters gets out of hand and emotions take over.

Many children are still learning how to conduct themselves, and it can be difficult for them to know how to act when faced with someone who disagrees with them, or otherwise find themselves in conflict with another person. It can also be tricky for parents/carers and educators to teach them how to resolve disputes in a mature and healthy manner. By teaming up with the ABA for Anti-Bullying Week, we (the National College) are bringing you expert advice on encouraging children to choose respect.

#### Remembrance Day and the Poppy Appeal

Following the 2 minute silence a brief ceremony, led by selected students, will take place at the front of school.

Poppies are on sale in Reception and will be brought around to tutor groups during START and DEAR. Please ensure that your children have some change (a donation of £1 is suggested) to buy a poppy if they wish to show their support.

#### Year 11 Mock Exams - 11th to 22nd November

All Year 11 students will be taking a series of Mock Exams between 11th and 22nd November. These will all be within normal school hours and there will be no 'study leave' for these exams. Students will attend their normal timetabled lessons when they are not in exams. The exams are a vital part of their preparations for GCSE and BTEC exams next Summer as they will provide students and staff with a clear idea of where their knowledge is secure and where additional support may be required.

Please support your child by ensuring that they are fully equipped for the exams. They will need:

- At least 2 black ball point pens
- At least 2 pencils and a pencil sharpener
- A ruler
- A scientific calculator
- A protractor and set of compasses
- A clear plastic bag or pencil case to hold their equipment for exams

# Should I keep my child off school?

# Yes

### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
