AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SIXTH FORM AND STUDENTS

We will provide for you:

- Initial and continuing guidance about courses to meet your needs.
- Appropriate teaching, setting and marking of home learning.
- Regular reports and assessments of progress which will take account of your abilities and your objectives for the future.
- Further review of progress whenever necessary on request.
- Facilities and resources for study and the encouragement to acquire sound learning skills and habits. (The Sixth Form Centre is open and you are welcome to study in it from 8.30am to 5.00pm).
- Careful and comprehensive advice and support about careers, both in education
 and in employment, a service which you can continue to use after you have left the
 college.
- A willingness to talk with yourself and your parent(s)/carers both at regular published meetings and whenever you request an appointment.
- A genuine concern for the welfare and development of all students. Staff are available for consultation and the help of outside agencies can be sought when needed. No student should ever feel that there is no-one in the school to turn to.

WHAT WE ASK OF YOU IN ORDER TO ENSURE YOUR OWN DEVELOPMENT AND SUCCESS

- Respect for others and their property at all times.

- A high rate of attendance with an absolute minimum of absences, both during and at the end of terms. Students with attendance rates of less than 90% in a subject will be expected to pay their own exam fees. Holidays should not be taken during term time.
- Prompt attendance at <u>all</u> timetabled registration, classes, tutorials, study periods and assemblies including the fulfillment of all additional commitments undertaken eg PSE sessions, work placements and projects, field trips, and all enrichment.
- Completion of signing in sheets on a daily basis.

- Any students falling behind with c/w etc need to attend during INSET days to catch up.
- The completing of all home learning, projects and assignments to set deadlines.
- The systematic use of study time to follow up and consolidate work covered in class.
 It is suggested as an approximate guideline, that an AS level subject needs four
 hours a week of independent study, a GCSE subject two hours, A2 subjects will
 require five hours of independent study.
- Respect for the working environment in the designated silent study areas.
- Your availability to staff who need to see you at times when you have no lessons timetabled.
